"Halloween is an exciting time for us in October and in September," says Gareth. "As a family we go out scouting and selecting new Halloween decorations or props that meet the G-PG rating system so all the children at Lambton Kingsway School (LKS) and the surrounding neighbourhoods can enjoy. We do a lot of searching in Canada and the United States for just the right decorations."

Last year, Gareth, Katherine, Kassandra, 11, Kaitlyn, 9 and Kaden, 7, calculated they had about 1,100

"We measure how many people visit by the number of chip bags we hand out," says Katherine. "Some of the TV stations came by last year which probably attracted more people to our house."

Gareth and Katherine love seeing all the faces of children (including their own) enjoy the decorations as well as seeing adults become children again as they view the Halloween landscape-the laughter is contagious.

"Halloween truly represents the Kingsway to us. We decided we wanted to live in the area as we drove through the neighbourhood one Halloween on our way to Magoo's restaurant. We could not believe the atmosphere or the sense of community and all the children and parents out laughing and enjoying themselves," says Gareth. "We knew this area represented everything we wanted in a community to raise our children. This is why we wanted to give back to the community - through Halloween, plant-

ing trees at LKS, initiatives like installing speed bumps and extra crossing guards around the school, providing support to neighbours and teachers when we can and where we can. People here make the effort to look after each other so we decided to make the effort on Halloween."

Along with their spooktacular Halloween house, the Owens give back in other ways. The family volunteers together to help developing countries establish baselines for maintaining a sustainable environment with a focus on clean water and sanitation projects in small communities, schools and orphanages.

"As the children grow and travel the world themselves, hopefully they will enter several of these communities to see a small part of how our family has helped others in the world," says Gareth. "They have recently been to Cambodia to see work we are starting at an orphanage. The children are fundraising for this orphanage to provide proper sanitation and clean water accessibility as well as other needs. They will work with their friends and classmates this year at LKS to raise these funds then travel

back again with us to aid in the implementation of this project."

The kids love travelling the globe with their parents and helping others and making new friends along the way. They have been to every continent except for Africa and Antarctica. However, Kassan-

dra, Kaitlyn and Kaden will be visiting Africa in 2017 to visit several communities the Owens have assisted in meeting their goals of clean water.

"My work is my family and has been since I met my wife fourteen years ago on a blind date," says Gareth. "Katherine transformed my world view from being a workaholic and bouncing





from one country to the next assisting clients with environmental issues. Before I met my wife, I would be away from Canada 90% of the time for work and now if we are away from Canada, we try to take our family."

Gareth is the President of GOwen Environmental Limited. Katherine works in the

investment industry and is an Executive Vice President and Portfolio Manager for a major mutual fund company. "Finding a balance between work and family is a priority for both of us," says Katherine and Gareth.

"Now our focus is on spending time with each other and our children. I try and create opportunities for my clients, my busi-



nesses and my family around the world or within Canada to assist them in creating a sound base for themselves and expose them to other ways of life or thinking," says Gareth.

They have lived in their Kingsway home for almost 10 years

"We bought the house because of the backyard and proximity to the school. We always wanted a big backyard with lots of trees," says Katherine. "When we bought the house, we got the big backvard but then planted almost 200 trees to create the feeling we were surrounded by nature, even though we are living right in the city. The location and the house are about our children with some things for us. Living steps from the crosswalk does help in getting the kids to school in the morning. We renovated the house to create a big kid and little kid fun house with slack and zip lines in the backyard and a slide inside the house.'

Travelling also gives the Owen kids the opportunity for them



to practice their water sports in the colder months such as surfing and windsurfing, but the Kingsway is their home, says Katherine.

"They love playing tennis at the Old Mill and the kids almost have their black belts after taking lessons from Master Kwan at National Taekwondo on Bloor Street. You couldn't ask for a more caring teacher," says Katherine. "This is truly one of the best places to live in Toronto - great neighbours, a subway ride downtown and a few minutes to the airport. Having the tennis courts/ ice rink, swimming pool and the Shale Pit Park next to LKS to play is icing on the cake to make this special place in the city to call

The Owen family's favorite Kingsway hotspots include Momiji (at least once or twice a week), Patricia's Cake Creations for coffee, cupcakes, pastries and the Farmers Market on Montgomery every Wednesday and to get back in shape after these great places. Jennifer Spreckley at Kingsway Pilates keeps them in shape. •

Carriage Trade Partners With Charity Helping Women In Shelters

Tarriage Trade is proud to announce a new partnership with The Shoebox Project for Shelters, supported by Dream.

The Shoebox Project began as a collaboration between four women from the Mulroney family: Caroline, Jessica, Katy and Vanessa. They were motivated to help women living in shelters, who had been displaced from their homes and facing economic challenges.

Since it was founded in 2011, over 55,000 gifts have been delivered with a value of \$2.75 million. Last year, 135 communities were serviced with 25,000 boxes delivered, and this year's goal is to reach 30,000 gifts.

The concept is simple. A shoebox is decorated and assembled by the donor to include a variety of items, such as: gift cards, mag-

azines, personal hygiene or beauty products. Each box is valued at \$50.

During the holidays, these packages are distributed by The Shoebox Project volunteers to women in shelters across

Canada and the United States.

"Reducing the feeling of isolation and bringing a sense of dignity and respect to these women are some of the important outcomes of The Shoebox Project", says Lesley Hendry, Executive Director.

I have always felt passionate about the concept of "women helping women". Stay tuned for an exciting fundraising event that will be hosted by Carriage Trade for The Shoebox Project this Fall.



Music Is Good For Your Heart And Soul

Cince the days of ancient Greece and Rome, music has been Orecognized for its contributions to the emotional, mental and

physical well-being of people. Traditional Chinese medicine also refers to the positive effects of specific instruments and musical sounds on various organs of the body.

Today, music therapy is a growing field in health care as the benefits of music are being used to manage pain, calm patients, promotes movement and ease

muscle tension. Music is also proving helpful in the treatment of patients with cancer, depression, anxiety and children with ADHD. It also helps put a bounce in your step each day.

Music with a strong beat stimulates brainwaves. Faster beats improve concentration and alertness while slower tempos promote a feeling of calm. From this, your brain learns how to regulate your brainwave activity as needed. This encourages a positive state of

mind, which helps people cope with depression and anxiety, and contributes to one's level of optimism.

Research has shown music played at approximately 60 beats per minute stimulates our alpha brainwaves, which promotes relaxed

> concentration, thus leading to improved learning. This research is known as The Mozart Effect because the music of Mozart, Bach and Brahms has produced the best test results.

> These positive changes to your brainwaves also have a beneficial affect on your breathing and heart rates. Music can help to slow both down, which activates the body's relaxation response, which, in turn, allows one to cope with chronic stress. Music also

helps the body by lowering blood pressure, boosting the immune system and easing muscle tension.

Here are some ways to make music part of your day:

- Start your day by listening to upbeat music
- · Listen to music while on your way to work or school
- Listen to music while doing housework.
- Listen to relaxing music while eating to reduce stress, which, in turn, aids digestion
- Soothing music can help you get to sleep

As the poet William Wordsworth once wrote, "The music in my heart I bore. Long after it was heard no more." •








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
